

# O'Sullivan Beach Boat Ramp

## Work commencing – Partial boat ramp closure

As part of the State Governments Marine Stimulus Package, we have upgraded the O'Sullivan Beach Boat Ramp facility. Built in 1983, the boat ramp is an important part of South Australia's marine infrastructure that is popular with recreational boat users, as well as an important facility for emergency services to launch and retrieve vessels.

### What's happening:

To ensure ongoing operational use, we are undertaking some minor finishing work on the recently upgraded boat ramps and handrails.

### How this affects you:

For us to undertake the works safely, two boat lanes will be temporarily closed at a time, during working hours. Works will move progressively around the boat lanes.

Three boat lanes will be available at all times throughout the works. Please observe on site signage, take care around construction vehicles, and follow the direction of traffic controllers.

No works will be undertaken on weekends and the public holiday Monday 11 March 2024 with all lanes open to boat ramp users for the entire long weekend.

Emergency service access will be maintained at all times.

Access will be maintained to the car park and beach at all times.
