

Stuart Highway Upgrades

Port Augusta to Pimba

We are undertaking shoulder rehabilitation and resealing works along the Stuart Highway, between Port Augusta and Pimba. These works are funded by the National Freight Highway Upgrade program to improve the safety and reliability of national freight routes and the Targeted Resilience to Improve National Supply Chain Resilience Program focused on flood recovery and improving the flood resilience of these important highways in the far north.

What's happening:

Pavement and shoulder rehabilitation is taking place along the Stuart Highway, between Port Augusta and Pimba. Works will commence 10km south of Pimba and move progressively towards Port Augusta.

How this affects you:

To do this work safely, we will have speed and lane restrictions moving progressively throughout the work areas. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers and follow the speed limits and signs. **The Stuart Highway will remain open at all times**, with speed restrictions still in place outside of work hours until all works are complete.

Access to properties and businesses will be maintained throughout works, with advance notice provided of any temporary access restrictions.
