Tea Tree Plaza New Park 'n' Ride

The South Australian Government has committed \$43.5 million to deliver additional parking at the Tea Tree Plaza Park 'n' Ride. This new Park 'n' Ride facility will be built around 100 metres east of the existing 700 park facility and increase the number of Park 'n' Ride spaces available to approximately 1200.

The additional parking will be delivered through the construction of a new four level building. The upgrade aims to meet demand for Park 'n' Ride commuters and increase public transport usage in the north-eastern suburbs.

Project timing

Early works to establish the substructure for the new Park 'n' Ride commenced in January 2023 and are now complete.

Major construction works on the superstructure will commence in mid-March 2023 and continue through September 2023, weather permitting.

The new car park is expected to be open to the public in mid-2024, weather permitting.

Construction activities

This stage of work involves establishing the superstructure and includes the construction of columns, stair cores, suspended slabs and roof steel. These are the main above ground components of the structure.

Works will involve the use of mobile cranes, concrete trucks and boom pumps. Excavators and watercarts will remain active on site.

Site layout

The layout overleaf shows an indicative location of the new Park 'n' Ride and how it will connect to the existing Park 'n' Ride building.

A ramp will connect the existing facility to the three upper levels of the new facility. All vehicles will access the expanded Park 'n' Ride through the existing Park 'n' Ride's access point.

To accommodate increased patronage of the Park 'n' Ride, future project stages will include modification works to the busway access road, its intersection with Smart Road, and the existing facility.
