

Strathalbyn Road Maintenance Works

Works Update – Vegetation Management

As part of ongoing maintenance works on Strathalbyn Road to improve road safety for all road users and the community, a vegetation survey has now been completed and additional vegetation management work is required.

What's happening:

As you may be aware, some vegetation pruning works were previously undertaken on Strathalbyn Road, with road shoulder sealing and surface improvement works continuing.

We recently undertook a vegetation survey along Strathalbyn Road which found that up to 10 trees needed to be removed and additional tree pruning is needed to improve line of sight and safety within the road corridor.

In some locations, there are large trees along the roadside which will not be removed for these works, and hazard protection treatments at these locations are being considered.

We would like to confirm that the large gum tree at the head of the Kidman Trail will not be impacted.

Every effort has been made to minimise the impact to vegetation wherever possible.

We understand the ecological importance of roadside native vegetation and will continue to prioritise minimising potential impacts to native vegetation and fauna associated with these works.

How this affects you:

Temporary lane and speed restrictions will be in place.

Please plan ahead, take extra care when workers are on site and observe speed limits and lane restrictions when travelling through the area.
