



PW2PA Alliance commences

The Port Wakefield to Port Augusta Alliance (PW2PA), a consortium of CPB Contractors, Aurecon, GHD, in alliance with the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure has been awarded the contract to design and construct the Joy Baluch AM Bridge Duplication Project. Design works have been progressing since March 2020, when the Alliance was formed.

The Australian and South Australian Governments have committed \$200 million (\$160 million from the Australian Government and \$40 million from the South Australian Government) for the Joy Baluch AM Bridge Duplication

Project. The Joy Baluch AM Bridge is an important link in the National Land Transport Network at Port Augusta, providing access across the Spencer Gulf for commuter, commercial and freight vehicles in the northern region of South Australia. It is also a key tourist connection to the Eyre Peninsula, northern South Australia and beyond.

The duplication of the Joy Baluch AM Bridge will improve road safety and efficiency for all users, as well as improve freight productivity and resilience of this critical road network.

Project Design

The works include:

- Duplication of the current bridge, with a new road bridge to provide two lanes for eastbound traffic movements across the Spencer Gulf.
- Reconfiguration of the existing bridge to provide two lanes, and conversion of the raised bicycle lane, to provide a shared use pedestrian and cycle path, for east and westbound movements.
- Dedicated shared use pedestrian and cycle path. In addition, there will now be an extension of the shared use path along the Augusta Highway from Mackay Street junction to Flinders Terrace intersection (new bridge side of Augusta Highway).
- Widening of approach road and embankments to achieve a continuous four lane road from Burgoyne Street to Mackay Street.

- Installation of traffic signals at the junction of Augusta Highway and Mackay Street. An additional second right turn lane at the junction will also now be provided.
- Installation of bridge barriers to both the new and existing bridges.
- Improved earthquake resistance and barrier upgrade of the bridge over the Adelaide to Darwin railway line.

As part of the delivery of the urban design for the project, the Alliance will collaborate with Aboriginal Groups, Port Augusta City Council and key stakeholders in the design and implementation of cultural elements to strengthen local identity, cultural respect and interpretation of place.

Site compound establishment and early works

From August 2020, the Alliance will establish the project site offices. The main site office will be located on the Eastside foreshore, between Tassie Street and Yuda Street. The site compound will consist of transportable office huts, a small amenities block and car parking for project staff. A small site compound will also be established on the Westside foreshore adjacent to On the Run (OTR). The project team will progressively mobilise to site between August and December 2020.

In addition to setting up site offices from August, Stage 1 traffic arrangements, between Burgoyne Street and Flinders Terrace, will be set up over approximately one week of night works to allow for construction of the new bridge to commence later this year. Activities will commence in mid-August and involve the removal of the existing traffic islands, line

marking and installation of temporary traffic barriers to shift traffic onto a new alignment until approximately early 2022. One lane of traffic will be maintained across the existing bridge in both directions. Speed and other traffic restrictions will be in place and signage will be prominently located to alert road users to the changed traffic conditions in advance of the works commencing.

Construction of a crane pad on the Eastside foreshore, adjacent the existing bridge, will also be installed in September 2020. This activity will result in short term, traffic restrictions on Tassie Street in this location. Traffic detours, including signage, will be in place and advance notice of these works and any temporary traffic detours will be provided to nearby businesses and residents.
