Works update – River Road vegetation management

As part of the maintenance works currently being undertaken on River Road to improve road safety for all users and the local community, a vegetation survey has now been completed.

What's happening:

As you are aware, vegetation pruning has been undertaken and is nearing completion.

To achieve the standard vegetation clearance envelope (up to 6 metres in height), the vegetation survey has identified that up to 27 trees along River Road need to be removed with approximately 6 requiring additional pruning.

As these works to improve line of sight and safety are occurring within the road corridor vegetation clearance envelope, they are considered a maintenance activity and no approval or permit is required in accordance with the *Native Vegetation Regulations 2017*.

Every effort has been made to minimise the impact to vegetation wherever possible.

There are some large trees along the roadside which will be retained and hazard protection treatments at these locations are being considered.

How this affects you:

Temporary lane and speed restrictions will be in place.

Please plan ahead, take extra care when workers are on site and observe speed limits and lane restrictions when travelling through the area.

From Tuesday, 24 October 2023 for completion in mid-November 2023.

Hours of operation

Between 7am and 7pm Monday to Saturday and between 9am and 5pm Sunday if required.

Where

River Road between Mount Barker Road, Hahndorf and Strathalbyn Road, Mylor.
