



Nairne Intersection Upgrade

Night Works Notification

Dear Resident/Business Owner

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is delivering improved safety and traffic efficiency through the construction of a four-way, single lane roundabout realigning the Woodside Road and Saleyard Road junctions with the Old Princes Highway, Nairne. The State Government has committed \$13 million to this project which is being delivered as part of the Adelaide Hills Intersections Upgrade Initiative.

Work to complete retaining walls, drainage infrastructure, and kerbing will continue until early 2022, weather permitting.

While the majority of these works are being undertaken during the day, **Monday to Saturday, between 7am and 6pm**, night works will be required to undertake pavement construction and placement of asphalt on Woodside Road, Old Princes Highway and Saleyard Road, in the vicinity of the intersection.

Night works to undertake pavement construction and placement of asphalt will be undertaken from Monday, 25 October 2021, for approximately one week, weather permitting. Hours of work are between 6pm and 6am, Monday to Friday.

To safely undertake these works, speed and lane restrictions will be in place. The junctions will remain open to traffic at all times. Please take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

Speed and lane restrictions will be in place in the vicinity of the works, however the junctions will remain open to traffic at all times. Please take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access to properties and businesses will be maintained. Please continue to support the local businesses.

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons there may be some restricted access. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours.

Public transport services will remain operational, however, bus stops in the vicinity of the works, along Old Princes Highway and Woodside Road, may require temporary relocation. Advance notice of any temporary
