



# South Eastern Freeway/ Cross Road/ Portrush Road/ Glen Osmond Road Intersection Pavement Rehabilitation

## Commencement of night works

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is undertaking major road pavement rehabilitation works on the South Eastern Freeway/ Cross Road/ Portrush Road and Glen Osmond Road intersection and at all approaches to the intersection.

This project is jointly funded (80:20) by the Australian and South Australian Governments under the South Eastern Freeway Pavement Rehabilitation Stimulus 2.

The works involve removing existing pavement and replacing it with new asphalt to ensure the long term safety and integrity of the intersection for all road users.

## Timing of works

To safely facilitate the works and minimise the impact to road users the majority of works will be undertaken at night from Sunday to Friday, **between 7pm and 6am**.

**Early works are planned to commence from Tuesday, 16 November, with major works commencing from Thursday, 18 November 2021, weather permitting. Project completion is expected in early 2022.**

## What to expect – changed traffic conditions

Early works for service investigations will require single lane closures and speed restrictions of 40km/h. Two way traffic will be maintained.

Major works will be undertaken in four separate sections, with activities underway in only one section at a time. Throughout the construction program works will return to each section on around three occasions. See map over the page.

Roads will remain open, with two way traffic maintained at all times and speed restrictions in place. Traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction through the work zone during work hours. Please expect some delays. Outside of work hours all lanes will be open to traffic with speed restrictions in place.

Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible. However, some short-term driveway access restrictions will be required. The project team will contact property owners in advance of any

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temporary impact to driveways to ensure suitable arrangements are in place.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

There will be some impacts to local bus stops during work hours, with advanced notice provided via signage on the bus stops. For further information regarding changes to bus stops and timetables please visit [www.adelaidemetro.com.au](http://www.adelaidemetro.com.au)

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons there may be some restricted access. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.

The Department appreciates your patience and cooperation while these important works are undertaken.

## Important information for heavy vehicles

**Heavy vehicles greater than 3.4 metres wide are currently not permitted to travel in either direction on the South Eastern Freeway between the Glen Osmond Tollgate and the Stirling Interchange without a permit.**

Where travel is not permitted, the detour is via Old Princes Highway, Karoonda Highway, Burdett Road, Bowhill Road (Council road), Morell Road Bowhill (Council road), Hunter Road, Stott Highway Swan Reach, Hunter Road to Sturt Highway Blanchetown (and vice versa).

Heavy Vehicle operators may apply for permits to travel with widths greater than 3.4 metres or oversize and over mass requirements. Please contact the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) directly to apply for this permit, website [www.nhvr.gov.au](http://www.nhvr.gov.au).

## Other work in the area

The Australian and South Australian governments have also jointly (50:50) committed \$61 million to upgrade the Cross Road and Fullarton Road intersection. Once complete, the upgrade will improve travel times and road safety, increase intersection capacity and enhance network reliability.
