Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road Intersection Upgrade

Project Update

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly (50:50) committed \$35 million to upgrade the Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road intersection. Once complete, the upgrade will improve travel times and road safety, increase intersection capacity and enhance network reliability.

We will provide regular updates to keep you informed on current and upcoming works. This is the first of these updates.

A Design and Construct contract has been awarded to Fulton Hogan Constructions and the main site office and storage compound has been established on the corner of Fullarton Road and Euston Avenue, Highgate. This facility will be used by the project team for the duration of the project.

Early works commenced in January 2022, and the new intersection is expected to be open to traffic late 2022, weather permitting.

What's Next: April to June 2022

Service relocation works

These works include the relocation of power, telecommunications, water and gas services.

While the majority of these works are being undertaken during the day, some night works are required to ensure the works can be undertaken safely and efficiently.

Night works for service relocations will continue until June 2022, and will be undertaken between 7pm and 6am, Sunday to Friday (including public holidays). There will be no night works undertaken on Saturdays.

Individual service providers, including SA Power Networks, Telstra, NBN, SA Water and APA Gas will advise property owners of any potential interruptions to services during these works.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

The intersection will remain open to traffic at all times. Speed and lane restrictions will be in place in the vicinity of the works.

Please take extra care when workers are on site and observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

The project team will contact individual property owners whose access is affected by the works. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to surrounding properties and road users, as much as practically possible.

Civil works

Preliminary works, including site clearing, property demolition works, and survey set out will continue throughout this period. A second site compound will also be established on the corner of Glen Osmond Road and Main Avenue in the coming weeks. Major drainage and road construction works will commence in mid-2022.

Temporary bus stops changes

To safely facilitate works, there will be some temporary relocations and closures of bus stops around the intersection. Advance notice of any temporary changes will be provided at the bus stops and on the Adelaide Metro website www.adelaidemetro.com.au

Pedestrian and Cyclists access changes

To safely facilitate works, pedestrian and cyclist detours will be in place from mid-2022.

Advance notice of these detours will be provided, and signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access.

Project design

The project design was updated following community consultation. This updated design was made available in November 2021. A copy of the project design is attached, with details of key elements highlighted in blue.

The key changes being made to the design in response to community feedback include:

- installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Glen Osmond Road and Main Avenue with dedicated left turn and right turn lanes on Glen Osmond Road to improve access and safety for local road users:
- the existing Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (PAC), signalised push-button crossing on Glen Osmond Road, will be retained. Retaining this signalised crossing will not impact the overall traffic flows along Glen Osmond Road:
- the inclusion of a PAC on Fullarton Road (south of the intersection), opposite the Arkaba Village Shopping Centre carpark, between Hone Street and Campbell Street, to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity;
- increased drainage to address existing flooding issues; and
- additional vegetation to be planted along the corridor.
