NOTICE OF DETERMINATION - REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO DOCUMENTS UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the FOI Act) received by this agency on 14 June 2023.

You have requested access to the following:

For the period 30 June 2022 and 01 June 2023, a copy of all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters, meeting agendas, diary entries, event attendance records and any other correspondence) between the Minister for Regional Roads and the Department for Infrastructure and Transport regarding the Strzelecki Track Upgrade and Sealing Project.

There are eleven (11) documents that fall within the scope of your application and are those that are listed in the attached document schedule.

I have determined to release in full Document 01, partially release Document 02 in accordance with section 20(1)(a) and clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act, and refuse release of Documents 03, 04, 05, 06, 07, 08, 09, 10 and 11 in accordance with section 20(1)(a) and Clause 17(c) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act which states:

20—Refusal of access

- (1) An agency may refuse access to a document—
 - (a) if it is an exempt document;...

6—Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).



17—Documents subject to contempt etc

A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the public disclosure of which would, but for any immunity of the Crown—

- (a) constitute contempt of court; or
- (b) contravene any order or direction of a person or body having power to receive evidence on oath; or
- (c) infringe the privilege of Parliament.

Clause 6(1)

Document 02 contains information that I consider to be the personal affairs of an individual, the release of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of their personal affairs. I therefore determine the information to be exempt from disclosure under clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

Clause 17(c)

Documents 03, 04, 05, 06, 07, 08, 09, 10 and 11 are Parliamentary Briefing Notes prepared for the purpose of the Minister's use in connection with Parliamentary investigation or debate and accordingly their disclosure is protected by Parliamentary privilege. These documents are considered exempt pursuant to clause 17(c) of Schedule 1 to the FOI Act.

If you are unhappy with this determination you are entitled to apply for an internal review in accordance with section 29 of the FOI Act. To make an internal review application, you can write a letter or send the attached form entitled *Application for Review of Determination* to the Principal Officer of this agency, the Minister for Local Government, Minister for Regional Roads and Minister for Veterans Affairs, the Hon Geoff Brock MP.

In accordance with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, if you are given access to documents as a result of this FOI application, details of your FOI application, and the documents to which you are given access, may be published in the agency's disclosure log. Your Rights to Review and Appeal

South Australian Freedom of Information Act 1991

Please read the information in this fact sheet before completing the attached application form

INTERNAL REVIEW

If you are unhappy with a determination made by an agency (includes South Australian State Government Agency, Local Government Council or University) under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act) in relation to:

- a freedom of information (FOI) application for access to a document, or
- an FOI application for amendment to your personal records

in most cases, you are entitled to apply for an Internal Review of that determination.

Request an Internal Review

An Internal Review must be lodged within 30 calendar days of you receiving advice of a determination that you are unhappy with.

Applications must be made in writing in accordance with Section 29 or Section 38 of the FOI Act or using the attached *FOI Application Form for Internal Review of a Determination* (Internal Review Form).

An Internal Review application must be made to the Principal Officer of the agency that made the determination you are seeking to have reviewed.

How much does an Internal Review cost?

There is an application fee of \$39.00 that must be paid when you lodge your Internal Review application if your review request is for access to documents.

There is no application fee for an Internal Review of an FOI application for amendment to your personal records.

Agencies generally accept payment by cash, money order or cheque. If you would like to pay by credit card you will need to ask the agency if they are able to accept credit card payments.

If, as a result of an Internal Review an agency changes or reverses a determination so that access to a document is, or will be, given, the agency will refund the Internal Review application fee paid by the applicant, where applicable.

What if I have a concession card or can't afford to pay?

If you are the holder of a current concession card or if you can satisfy the agency that the payment of the application fee would cause financial hardship, the agency must waive or remit (reduce or refund) it.

If you are a concession cardholder you will need to provide evidence e.g. attach a copy of your concession card when you make the application. Alternatively, you will need to give written reasons as to why the payment of a fee would cause you financial hardship.

How long does an Internal Review take?

You will be advised of the outcome of your Internal Review application within 14 calendar days of it being received by the agency.

If the agency does not deal with your Internal Review application within 14 calendar days (or you remain unhappy with the outcome of the Internal Review) you are entitled to an External Review

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by the Ombudsman SA. Alternatively, you may apply for a review by the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (SACAT). See the External Review section below.

When can't I apply for an Internal Review?

If the original application determination was made by the Principal Officer of an agency rather than another accredited FOI Officer within the agency, you cannot apply for an Internal Review. However, you can apply for an External Review by the Ombudsman SA or apply for a review by SACAT.

EXTERNAL REVIEW

After an Internal Review has been completed, or where you are unable to apply for an Internal Review, and you are unhappy with the determination, you have the right to apply for an External Review. All applications for External Review should be made to the Ombudsman SA.

How long will an External Review take and how much will it cost?

If you wish to make an application for an External Review you must do so within 30 calendar days after being notified of the determination. However, the Ombudsman SA can extend this time limit at their discretion. There is no fee or charge for External Reviews undertaken by the Ombudsman.

You have a right to apply for a review by SACAT if you are unhappy with:

- a determination not subject to Internal Review
- an Internal Review determination, or
- the outcome of a review by the Ombudsman SA.

You must exercise your right of review with SACAT within 30 calendar days after being advised of the above types of determinations or the results of a review.

Any costs will be determined by SACAT, where applicable.

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PURPOSE

To provide an update on the Strzelecki Track Upgrade Project.

BACKGROUND

- The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly committed
 \$215 million (excluding GST) in funding for the Strzelecki Track Upgrade Project.
- The Strzelecki Track is a 472 kilometre (km) unsealed outback road that links the
 towns of Lyndhurst to Innamincka in the north-east of South Australia. It is a vital
 supply line for major oil and gas facilities located near Moomba, in the Cooper
 Basin, and is an essential transport corridor for outback communities, tourism and
 pastoralists.
- The works include pavement rehabilitation and sealing along the existing road alignment, targeted floodway treatments, junction upgrades and an upgrade of the Strzelecki Creek crossing.


KEY POINTS

- During February 2023, there was one inclement weather event which resulted in the closure and/or restrictions to traffic on the Strzelecki Track for a total of six days.
 There was no damage to the areas under construction.
- Construction continues on the 93km section south of Moomba to the Strzelecki Creek Crossing. A total of 73km (78%) pavement rehabilitation is complete with a total of 65km (69%) sealed. Remediation works to the existing sealed overtaking lane has commenced.
- Construction continues on the 41km section south of Innamincka, locally known as Dillon's Highway. A total of 33km (80%) pavement rehabilitation is complete, with a total of 21km (51%) sealed. Wet maintenance of unsealed sections continues, and stabilisation works commenced in preparation for sealing. Yandruwandha / Yawarrawarrka Traditional Owners are onsite monitoring works in a culturally sensitive area.
- Design contract for Della Road continues, 70% design and cost estimate received and under review.
- Tender call for 47km section from Strzelecki Creek Crossing to Cobblers Sandhills tender is scheduled to close 23 February 2023.
- Site investigations on the 154km section from Cobblers Sandhills to Yeralina Creek continue with 100km (65%) complete. Initiation of environmental and heritage surveys on completed sections in progress.
- As at the end of February 2023, a total of 174km (37%) of the 472km Strzelecki Track has been constructed.
- Of the 98,094 onsite construction hours undertaken to date (as at end of February 2023), 23,603 hours (24%) have been worked by local Aboriginal people.
- Stages and Status of works:
 - Stage 1: Lyndhurst to Yeralina Creek (74km) Complete.
 - o Stage 1 (early works): Innamincka to Dillons Highway (10km) Complete.
 - Stage 2 Package 1: South of Moomba to the Strzelecki Creek Crossing (93km) – Under Construction.

- Stage 2 Package 2A: Dillons Highway to Della Road (41km) Under Construction.
- o Stage 2 Package 2B: Della Road (50km) Design.
- Stage 2 Package 3: Strzelecki Creek Crossing to Cobblers Sandhills (47km) – Procurement.
- o Stage 3 Package 1: Cobblers Sandhills to Mount Hopeless (50km) Planning.
- o Stage 3 Package 2: Mount Hopeless to Dog Fence (50km) Planning.
- o Stage 3 Package 3: Dog Fence to Yeralina Creek (54km) Planning.

PURPOSE

To respond to the correspondence from Clause 6(1)
 Clause 6(1)
 regarding the condition of the Strzelecki Track.

BACKGROUND

• On 8 March 2023, Clause 6(1) wrote to you on Clause 6(1) regarding the condition of the Strzelecki Track.


KEY POINTS

- The Strzelecki Track is a 472 kilometre unsealed rural road that links the towns of Lyndhurst to Innamincka in the north east of South Australia.
- It is a vital supply link for major oil and gas facilities located near Moomba in the Cooper Basin, and is an essential transport corridor for outback communities, tourism and pastoralists.
- The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly committed
 \$215 million (excluding GST) in funding for the Strzelecki Track Upgrade Project.
- The works include pavement rehabilitation and sealing along the existing road alignment, targeted floodway treatments, junction upgrades and an upgrade of the Strzelecki Creek crossing.
- As at end of March 2023, a total of 188 kilometres (40%) of the 472 kilometre Strzelecki Track has been sealed.
- From September 2020 through to March 2023, the Strzelecki Track was impacted by 35 separate inclement weather events.
- These events have resulted in the Strzelecki Track being closed to all traffic for a total of 82 days, with a further 184 days where restrictions were in place while the track was progressively opened to all traffic.
- The unsealed road requires maintenance grading on a regular basis. It is subject to bulldust holes and sand drifts during dry periods and flooding during seasonal rain events, all of which negatively impact the safety, accessibility and efficient operation of the road.
- Contractors have been engaged and repairs to identified problem areas on both the sealed and unsealed sections of the Strzelecki Track commenced on 20 March 2023 and will be completed by 12 April 2023, weather permitting.
- A locality map of the Strzelecki Track Upgrade Program is attached.
- In December 2022, Strzelecki Track, the section between Montecollina and Yeralina Creek (commencement of seal), approximately 150 kilometres in length was graded by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport maintenance contractor.
- Due to increased movements of heavy machinery in January 2023, additional grading from Yeralina Creek to the Strzelecki Creek Crossing (approximately 200 kilometres) was carried out between 21 January and 8 February 2023.
