

Advance Works Notice

East Parklands Road Upgrades

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport is undertaking upgrading work including road resurfacing in the East Parklands area of Adelaide in preparation for the Adelaide 500 race event in December 2022.

Upgrading work will affect the following areas:

Victoria Park

- Upgrading work in the Adelaide Parklands Circuit, within Victoria Park/Pakapakanthi, is already underway. This includes kerb replacements and track upgrades.
- Some temporary restrictions will be in place around the work sites.
- Pedestrians and cyclists should follow directional signage. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.

East Parklands roads

- Upgrading work on the roads surrounding the East Parklands is scheduled to start in late August 2022, and be completed in early October 2022, weather permitting.
- Work will be scheduled to minimise the impact to motorists and will take place outside peak traffic times, at night and on weekends.
- Speed and lane restrictions will be in place including a series of temporary traffic detours. Advance notice of local detours will be provided to residents and businesses and signage will be in place to notify motorists.

Britannia roundabouts

- Upgrading work will include replacing sections of the small Britannia roundabout.
- The large Britannia roundabout will remain open throughout the work.
- Access will be maintained to Dequetteville Terrace, Fullarton Road and Kensington Road, however speed and lane restrictions will be in place.

Please plan ahead

- Motorists should expect delays while upgrading work is in progress.
- Please plan ahead, allow additional travel time and take extra care when workers are on site.
- Remember to follow signage, speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.
- 40km/h speed restrictions may apply outside of working hours when all lanes are open to traffic.

Residents and local business

Access to local businesses and residences in the area will be maintained during the work wherever possible, and advance notice will be provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access. Please continue to support the local businesses.

Some noise disturbance can be expected while work is underway, however the work will be scheduled to minimise disturbance as much as possible.

Pedestrians and cyclists should take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons there may be some restricted access. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.
