South Australian Regional Bridge **Upgrades**

Upcoming works and heavy vehicle detour

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is upgrading a series of bridges and culverts across regional South Australia to extend the service life of the structures and improve safety for road users.

As part of this program, the Department is replacing the bridge over Spring Creek and the culvert at Little Spring Creek, on the Horrocks Highway, south of Wilmington.

These works are jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments as part of the South Australian Rural Roads Package.

Spring Creek

Early works are underway with construction works planned to start shortly. Project completion is expected in mid 2023, weather permitting.

The works will include replacing the existing bridge with a wider structure and installing new safety and bridge barriers. Works will be undertaken between 7am and 5pm, Monday to Fridays and between 7am and 5pm on Saturdays until the completion of the Project.

To safety undertake these works a temporary detour will be in place for approximately two weeks, see details overleaf. Once Horrocks Highway re-opens, traffic will be reduced to a single lane with temporary traffic signals in place to control the direction of traffic. Speed restrictions will also be in place throughout the work area.

Little Spring Creek

Early works are underway with construction works planned to start from Wednesday, 5 October 2022. Project completion is expected in late 2022, weather permitting.

Works will include replacing the existing culvert with a wider structure and installing new safety barriers.

To minimise the impacts to road users, works will be undertaken continuously, both day and night for approximately two weeks, weather permitting. The planned temporary detour for Spring Creek will also allow works to be undertaken for Little Spring Creek.

Speed restrictions will be in place through the works area once Horrocks Highway re-opens to traffic until the completion of the works in early November 2022, weather permitting.





Temporary detours

To accommodate both these works, a road closure will be in place on Horrocks Highway between Willowie Road and Spring Creek Road from Wednesday, 5 October 2022, for approximately two weeks, weather permitting.

During this time temporary detours will be in place for all vehicles around the bridge over Spring Creek and the culvert at Little Spring Creek. Please see map overleaf for heavy vehicle detour details. (For light vehicle detours see the project website www.dit.sa.gov.au/SARegionalBridges).

Following the two week detour period, Horrocks Highway will re-open to traffic with a short diversion track in place adjacent to the Spring Creek Bridge.

What to expect

Variable Message Signs are in place and will provide early notice of the traffic restrictions and detours.

Road users are asked to please plan ahead, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access for emergency service vehicles will be maintained through both worksites at all times during the works.

The Department appreciates your co-operation and patience while these important works are undertaken.

Important information for heavy vehicles

Horrocks Highway will be closed south of Wilmington between Willowie Road and Spring Creek Road, with detours around both bridges for Heavy Vehicles over 4 tonnes, from Wednesday, 5 October 2022, for approximately two weeks, weather permitting.

Heavy vehicles (travelling from Wilmington towards Adelaide) will be required to detour either via Willlowie Road, Price Maurice Road (Council Road), Booleroo Road (Council Road), White Cliffs Road (Council Road) and Nukunu Yarta Way (Council Road) to Horrocks Highway, or alternatively via Horrocks Pass Road, Augusta Highway and Wilkins Highway to Horrocks Highway.
