

Heaslip Road and Curtis Road Intersection Upgrade

Early works update

Supporting growth, improving road safety and reducing congestion in northern Adelaide

We are constructing a new dual lane roundabout at the intersection of Heaslip Road and Curtis Road, Angle Vale.

This \$30 million project is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (50:50), with the Australian Government's contribution funded through the \$1 billion Priority Works Stream and Housing Support Program (HSP).

What's happening

As part of our project planning, site investigation activities will be undertaken near the intersection from mid-June 2025.

During this time, we will also take the opportunity to relocate some of the underground utility services that have already been identified as needing to be moved through our early planning and design process.

We are currently progressing the development of the design for the upgrade and we look forward to sharing more information, including the final concept design, in the coming months.

Major works are planned to start in early 2026.
